CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL MEMBER COMPANIES

Re: Thirty-First Annual Meeting October 28, 2008

The Thirty-First Annual Meeting of the North Carolina Rate Bureau will convene at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, October 28, 2008. The meeting will be held at the Grandover Resort and Conference Center, One Thousand Club Road, Greensboro, North Carolina 27407.

Immediately following adjournment of the Thirty-First Annual Meeting, a meeting of the Governing Committee will convene. The agenda for this meeting will be distributed in advance of the meeting.

The following constitutes the agenda for the Annual Meeting:

1. The Annual Report

The Thirty-First Annual Report will be presented.

2. <u>Governing Committee Election</u>

The Rate Bureau's Constitution provides that the Governing Committee shall be composed of six stock company members, six non-stock company members and two non-voting public members appointed by the Governor. With respect to the company members the Constitution provides that at least one member of the Governing Committee shall be a company domiciled in North Carolina, and that at each Annual Meeting the scheduled vacancies occurring in the Governing Committee shall be filled by the election of two stock and two non-stock companies to serve for terms of three years.

The current company members of the Governing Committee are:

It will be in order to elect two stock and two non-stock members for three-year terms to expire in 2011. The Constitution provides that no member shall be eligible to serve consecutively more than two three year terms as a member of the Governing Committee. Of the four companies whose terms expire this year, North Carolina Farm Bureau Mutual Insurance Company and Hartford Fire Insurance Company will not be eligible for re-election since those companies will be completing a second successive three year-term.

The Chairman of the Governing Committee has appointed a Nominating Committee, and the report of that Committee will be presented.

3. Any other business which might properly come before the meeting.

We urge that you have a representative of your company in attendance at this meeting. For those companies that cannot be represented, voting by proxy is permitted. A proxy form is enclosed which we request you complete and return as soon as possible, but no later than September 25, 2008, whether or not your company expects to be represented in person. This will help assure a quorum is present. If a representative of your company is present at the meeting, the proxy will not be used. It is suggested that member companies consider naming as proxy one of the twelve current company members of the Governing Committee.

Enter onto East Bryan Blvd by turning RIGHT

Take the Winston Salem Exit off of Bryan Blvd staying on I-40 East to Exit #218 (Greensboro/Charlotte/High Point)

Merge RIGHT to Groometown Road/Grandover Parkway Exit

Turn RIGHT onto Groometown Road

Take LEFT off of Bryan Blvd into Airport

Turn LEFT at the first stoplight onto Grandover Parkway

The Resort's entrance is on the right at 1.3 miles.

Directions to Piedmont Triad International airport: (16 Miles)

Turn LEFT onto Grandover Parkway, for 1.3 Miles At Stoplight, Turn RIGHT onto Groometown Road Cross over Bridge and Turn LEFT at Light Bear RIGHT at first exit (before actually getting onto I-85) Exit LEFT to I-40 West/73 North to Winston Salem Exit # 212A (Bryan Blvd/PTI Airport Exit) Exit # 3 (Bryan Blvd/PTI Airport)

Arriving from the West (Winston-Salem, Asheville, Hickory, Mt. Airy):

Follow Interstate 40 East into Greensboro You will see (2) 85 signs, One 85 South and One 85 North Take first Exit which is 85 South Exit Road will then split Bear RIGHT to take Groometown Road Exit Turn RIGHT onto Groometown Road Turn LEFT at the first stoplight, onto Grandover Parkway The Resort entrance is on the right at 1.3 miles.

Arriving from Highway 421 (Siler City)

421 to exit 197 (Winston-Salem/Charlotte Exit) 85 South to 122A to Groometown Rd., Grandover Exit. Turn right at the light. Turn left at the next traffic light onto Grandover Parkway.
